FOE website/directory. The Frontiers of Engineering website is at [www.nae.edu/frontiers](http://www.nae.edu/frontiers). After the meeting, all of the PPT slides from the presentations will be available on the FOE website. In addition, there is a directory of Frontiers participants. To access the private directory for Frontiers participants, you will need to enter the user name “frontiers” and the password “FOE.” This directory includes searchable research interests and engineering fields for all Frontiers alums, as well as the ability to search by geographic area, affiliation, and year attended.
